

According to the National Domestic Violence Hotline, an average of 24 people per minute are victims of rape, physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States. That's more than 12 million people over the course of a year. Author and survivor Tahirah Ogletree accomplishes it with this in her newly released Survivor's Celebrating Life Beyond Domestic Violence coffee table book. Along with an array of powerful, uplifting inspirations from world -renowned leaders, 14 heroic domestic violence survivors share their vivid tearjerking testimonials, including two-



time Olympic Gold Medalist and former WNBA All-Star Champion Ruthie Bolten's untold story.

This book proves that no matter what you might be facing, everyone can heal and move forward with faith, forgiveness, strength and perseverance. It targets not just physical and sexual abuse, but other key factors such as psychological and emotional. The book provides an in-

depth look at how perpetrators terrorize and manipulate victims sometimes to the point of death.

While the book educates on the epidemic of domestic violence, it also gives hope and positive light to its readers through encouragement, self-proclamation, and education on behaviors associated with domestic violence. It also has a list of 24 hour domestic violence hotlines for victims and batterers with highly trained advocates for immediate support and so much more!

After 16 years, Tahirah Ogletree, actress, charismatic leader, and indie filmmaker, broke her silence as a domestic violence survivor by advocating for those struggling to live beyond the power of the fist. Tahirah has dedicated her life to loving others and showing them how to become all that God has intended them to be.


